About **PUSPADI Bali**

PUSPADI Bali is an NGO operating in Bali, Indonesia, providing high-quality rehabilitation, mobility aids, advocacy and empowerment programs to people with physical disabilities in Bali and East Indonesia. We are also partnering with local, national & international organizations as well as local government to work together, bringing greater range of impact for people with disabilities. Our small team of 19 staff (65% are people with disabilities) make and distribute appropriately fitted prostheses and orthoses, deliver wheelchairs and regularly do home visits for monitoring and evaluation, and to find more local people with disabilities in need.

YEAR IN REVIEW 2025

Key Milestone of 2025

- Distributed hundreds of prosthetics, orthotics, and wheelchairs to people with physical disabilities across Bali and Eastern Indonesia.
- Expanded outreach to remote communities, ensuring access to rehabilitation services for marginalized groups especially women and girls with disabilities until way to Maluku Province
- Supported inclusive education initiatives, enabling children with disabilities to access schooling with proper support to break the chain of poverty.
- Strengthened partnerships with local government and NGOs to promote disability-inclusive policies especially in the provision of adaptive assistive devices.

Challenges and Lesson Learned of 2025

- **Policy Gaps:** Existing regulations were not comprehensive enough to fully protect the rights of people with disabilities, especially in areas like adaptive assistive devices and technology, disaster mitigation and workplace inclusion.
- **Employment Barriers:** Many people with disabilities continued to face discrimination and limited opportunities in the labor market.
- **Accessibility Issues:** Infrastructure and public services in Bali still lacked consistent accessibility, limiting independence for people with disabilities.
- **Disaster Risk:** Bali's vulnerability to natural disasters highlighted the lack of inclusive disaster management systems.

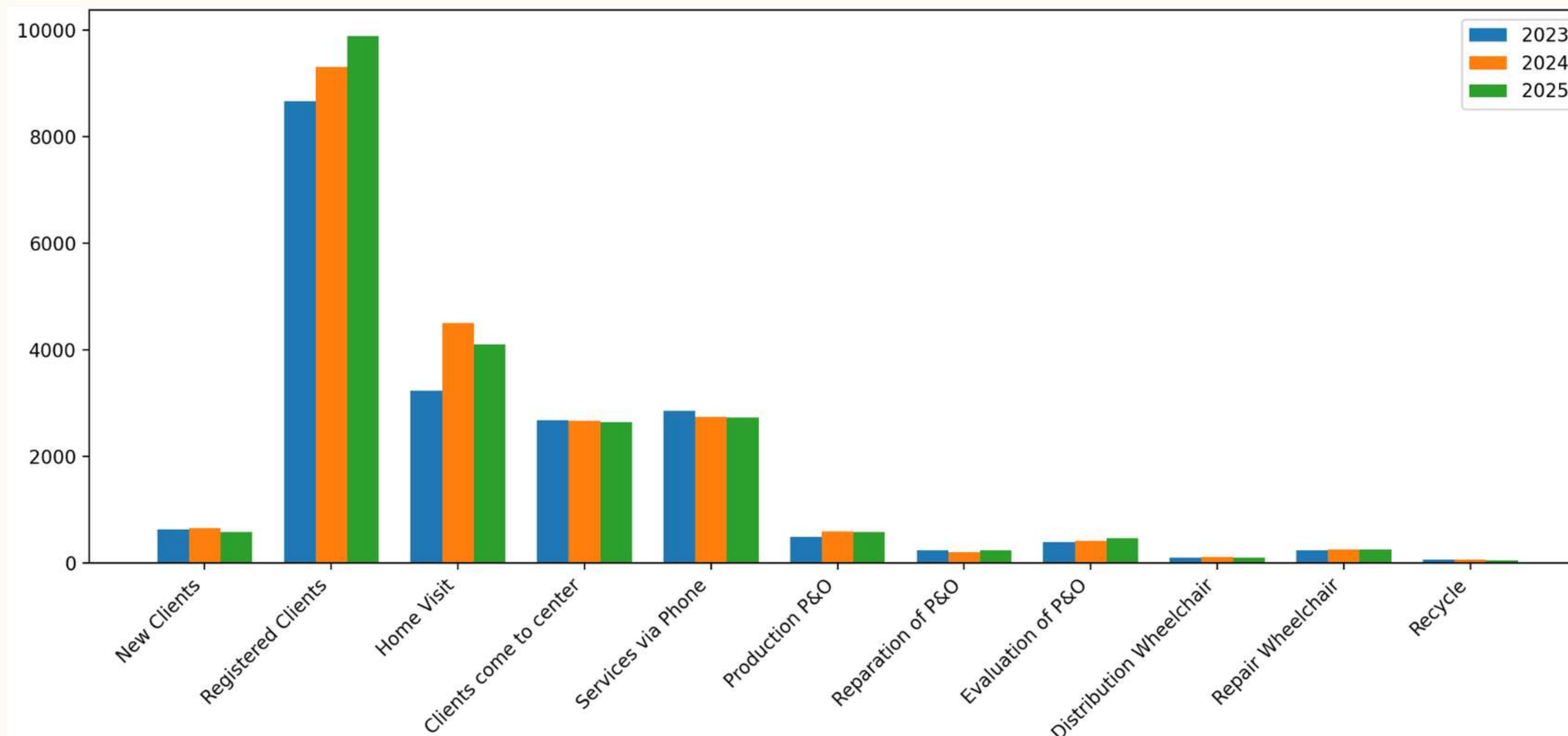

Client's Distribution 2025

Of the 578 new clients registered in 2025, 90% are still dominated by clients from Bali, but are spread fairly evenly across various areas such as: Java (East Java, West Java), NTB, NTT, Southeast Maluku, South Sulawesi, North Kalimantan & South Sumatra.



Needs and Type of Disability of New Clients 2025

In 2025, the majority need is assistive devices, with 465 requests. Furthermore, demand for food staple also quite high.

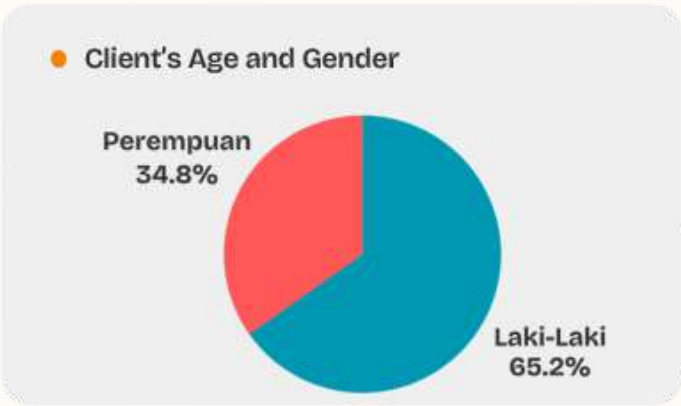
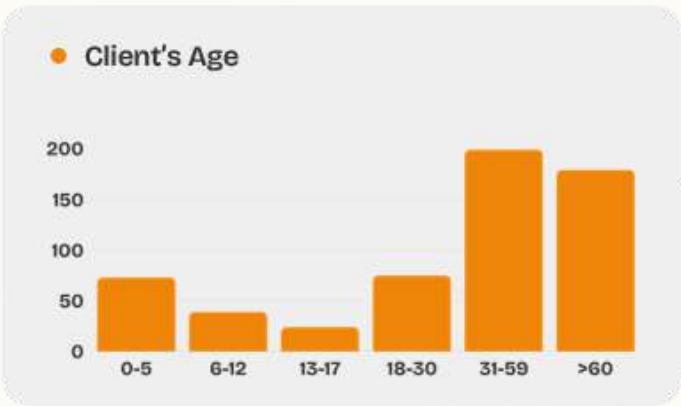
Of the 578 new clients in 2025, the clients with the most disabilities were clients with other disabilities (growth and development, tiptoe walking, scoliosis, etc.), followed by CP, amputation, stroke, polio, CTEV & SCI.

Client's Age and Gender 2025

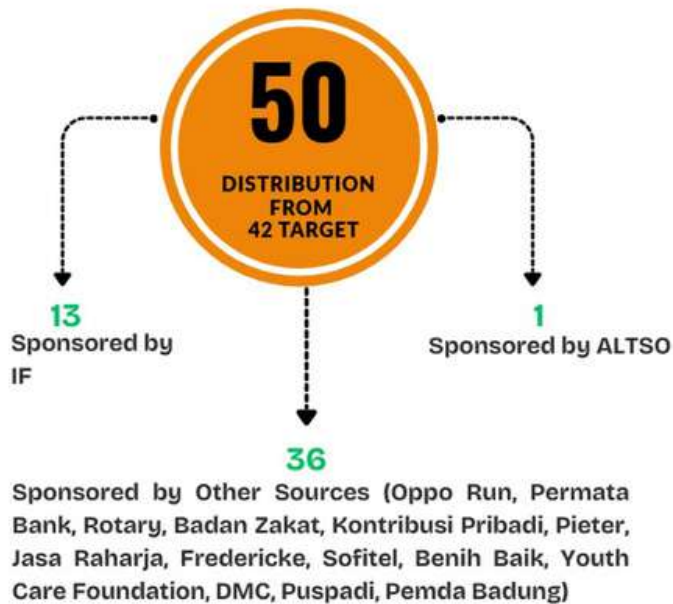
Of the 578 new clients in 2025, 199 were dominated by clients in the 31-59 age range, and overall, 65.2% (384 people) were still dominated by male clients.

Achievement Above Knee

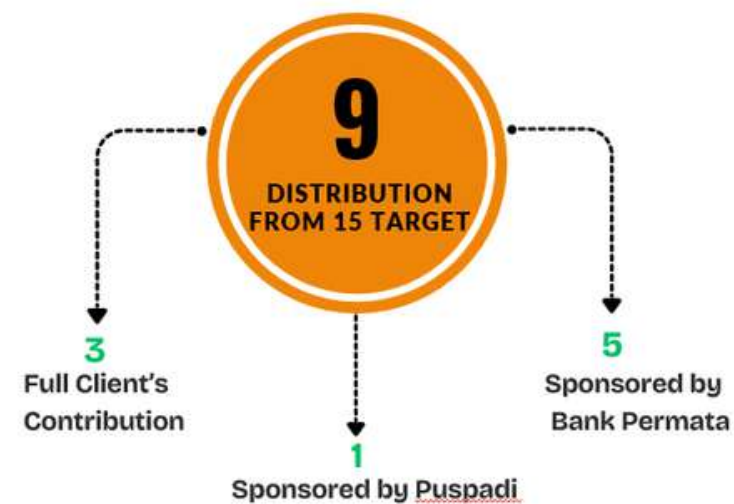


Achievement Below Knee

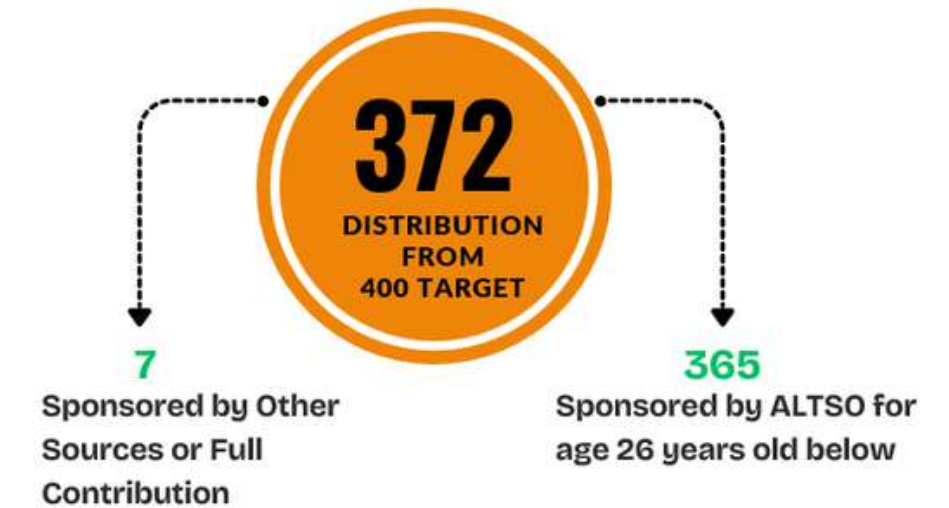

Achievement AFO

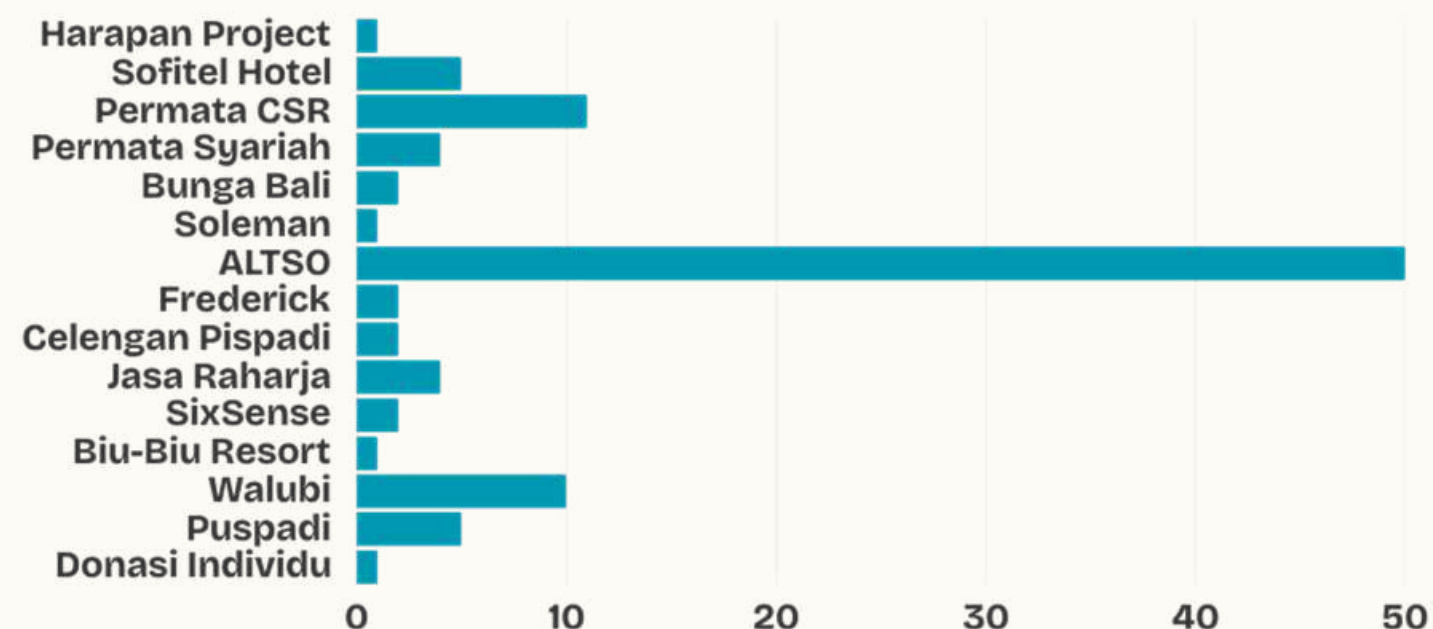

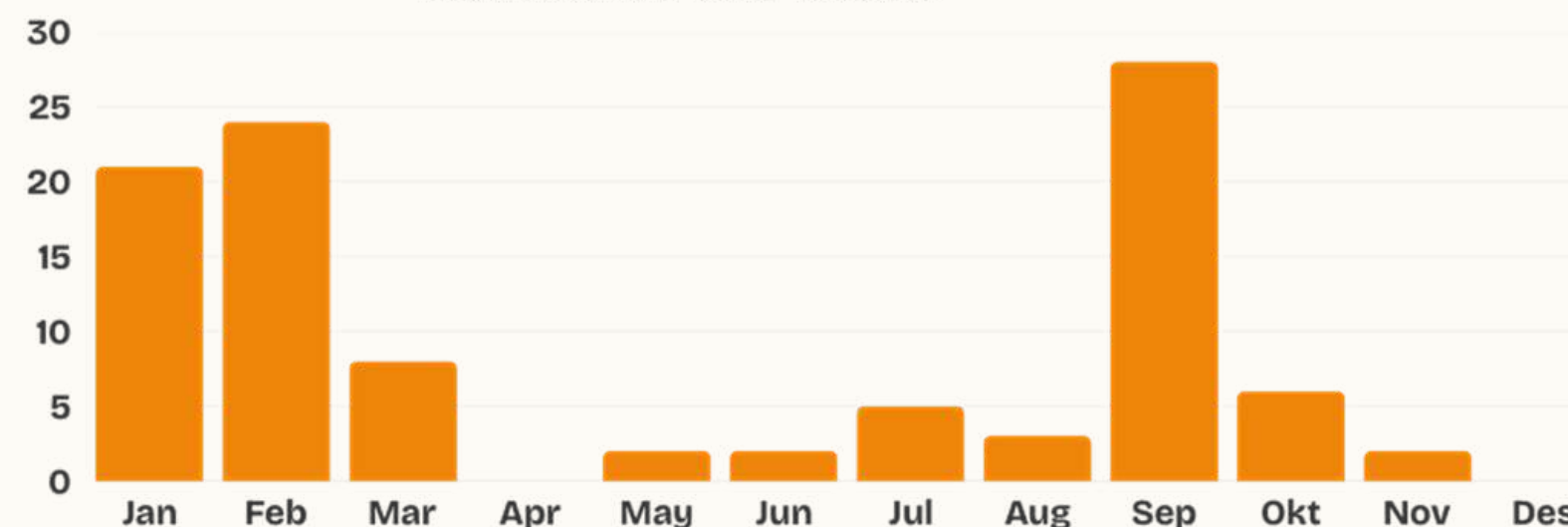


Wheelchair Program

Distribution Jan-Dec 25



During 2025, 101 wheelchairs were distributed. Of these, the largest number were children's wheelchairs sponsored by ALTSO. This was followed by 11 wheelchairs sponsored by Permata CSR and 10 wheelchairs sponsored by Walubi Bali.



Sponsored by **Inspirasia Foundation**, wheelchair team managed to recycle 70 units of unused wheelchairs to produce 50 units of upcycled wheelchairs

ADVOCACY PROGRAM



In November 10, 2025, Puspadi Bali successfully held a hearing and submitted the academic draft and draft gubernatorial regulation for Inclusive Disaster Risk Reduction for Persons with Disabilities in Bali Province. The hearing was well-received by **Bali Governor, I Wayan Koster** and marked a strategic first step in encouraging the ratification and implementation of the policy.

This process certainly owes much to the support of various parties. Thank you DRAF (Disability Rights Advocacy Fund) and Inspirasia Foundation for supporting PUSPADI Bali throughout this advocacy process, ensuring the continued progress of efforts to promote more inclusive policies all sectors including on adaptive assistive devices and technology.





PUSPADI Bali's Scholarship Program is designed to improve access to education for children and young people with disabilities by reducing financial and social barriers that often limit their opportunities to learn and grow. Through this initiative, PUSPADI Bali provides educational support that may include school-related costs, learning access, and individualized assistance to help participants continue their education and reach their full potential.



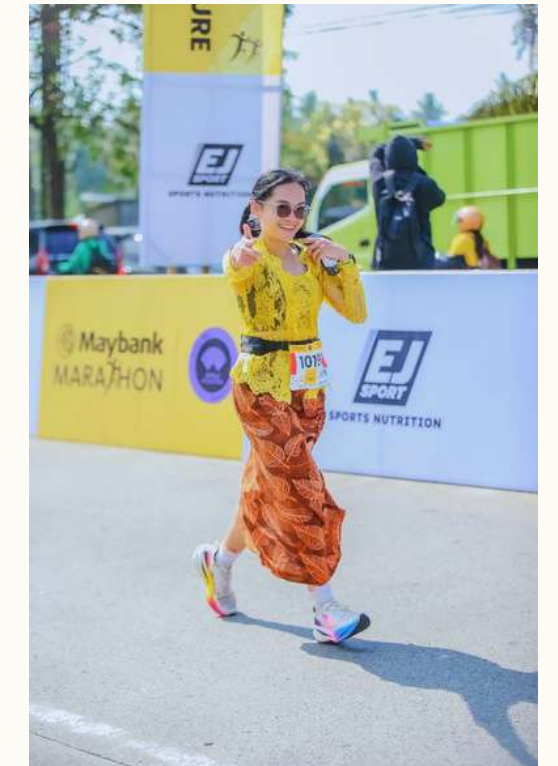


PUSPADI Bali's Accessible Housing Program supports people with physical disabilities—particularly wheelchair users and families living in vulnerable economic conditions—to live in safer, more accessible, and more independent home environments.

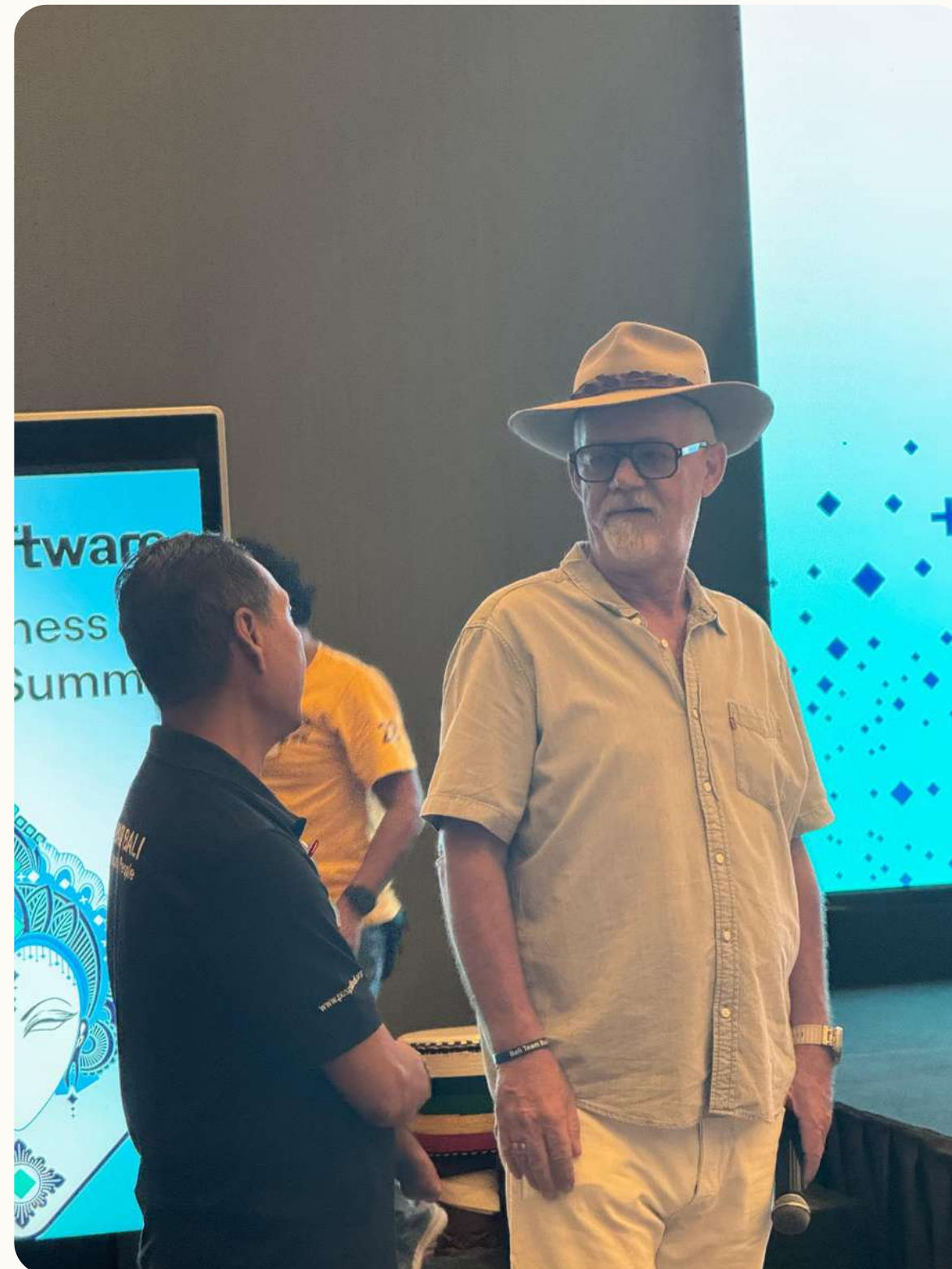

Financial Overview

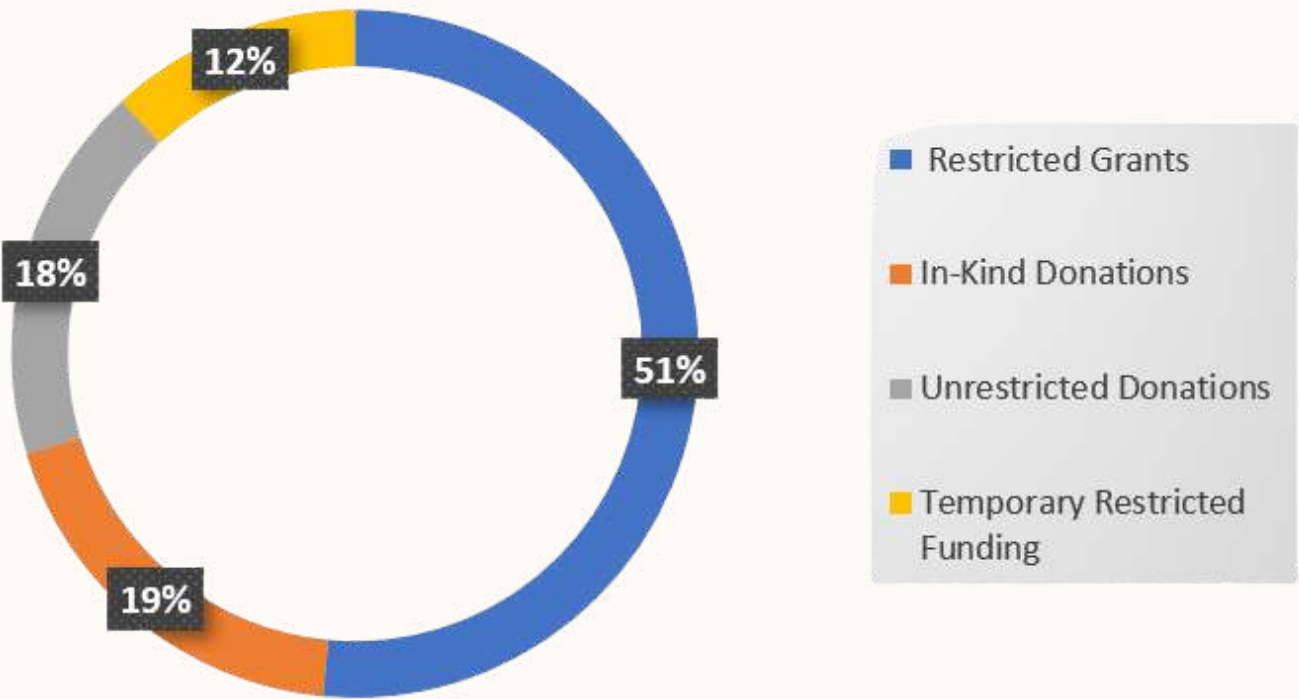
**IDR 5.08 Billion

- 48% (IDR 2.42B) funded through diversified sources



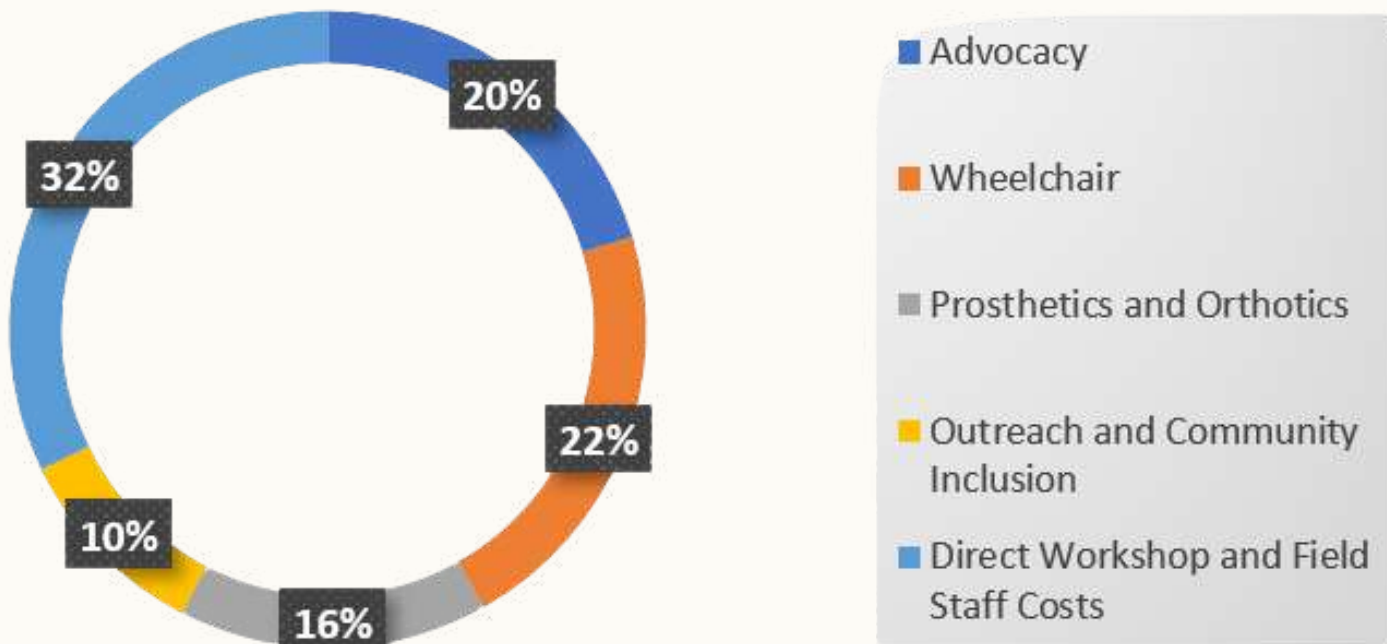
Financial Position

Governance & Leadership

Board of Directors

PUSPADI Bali is governed by a volunteer Board of Directors and supported by advisory and supervisory boards, ensuring accountability, inclusivity, and strong advocacy for people with disabilities. Its leadership combines community-based governance with professional management, reflecting a balance of grassroots empowerment and organizational oversight.

Key Staff Members

OUR STORY

NI KADEK NIA FIRNITA DEWI (18 YEARS OLD)

Born without a left foot, Ni Kadek Nia Firnita Dewi, often called Nia, had to walk with a limp every time she went to school. She also constantly felt pain in her lower back because her legs were uneven.

Things changed when she received a prosthetic leg from Puspadi Bali in first grade. It took only one week for her to get used to it, and with great enthusiasm, Nia began her journey with her first prosthetic leg. It was as if Nia found herself again. Now, Nia is doing her internship (PKL) and has also started her own business in beauty as a make-up artist (MUA). She says her prosthetic leg helps her stand for up to 12 hours without pain. Not only that, but Nia is also actively developing her talents in singing and playing guitar. She has even won competitions in Badung and Denpasar. Thanks to her talent, she is often invited to sing at weddings and school events.

OUR STORY

IDA SULASNIA (39 YEARS OLD)

In 2018, Ida Sulasnia, commonly known as Ida, had to let go of her right leg after a motorcycle accident in Sumbawa. In an instant, this mother of three had to face a new reality. For several months after the incident, Ida had to get used to walking with crutches. Sometimes she slipped, even when simply trying to go to the bathroom at night. This also made it difficult for Ida to run her cracker business.

Fortunately, Ida had the opportunity to meet Puspadi Bali and receive her first prosthetic leg. Now, Ida can return to her daily activities as normal. She can again sell rambak crackers to small shops and houses, riding her own motorcycle. With her experience, Ida continues to motivate other Sumbawa residents who face similar challenges. She hopes that what she has experienced can also be experienced by others in Sumbawa. "We must not lose spirit; we must live with what God has given us," said Ida.
